**) The study of a minor subject does not normally entitle you to the admission to a master-course because the necessary credits are not achieved.

1) According to the admission regulations (“Zugangsordnung”) proof of language proficiency in English or French is required.

2) For the subjects Art/Art Education and Music, proof of a successful entrance examination (Aufnahmeprüfung) is the requirement for registration.

Art: School of Cultural and Geo Sciences, Registration deadline **1st June** (tbc)

Music: School of Education and Cultural Studies, Registration deadline **1st May**

3) The combination of the core subject „Environmental science“ is especially suited to be combined with Mathematics, Physics, Computer Science, (incl. Geo- und Neuroinformatics), Chemistry, Biology, Geography, Economics (VWL) as well as Politics or Sociology.

Two core subjects or a **major** and a **minor** subject can be studied. In general, most subjects can be combined. A few subjects can not be combined however, such as Protestant Theology with Catholic Theology or Politics with Sociology.
