



# Blended Intensive Programme Summer School – February 2026 at the Babeş-Bolyai-University in Cluj-Napoca, Romania

# CONFLICT RESOLUTION FROM THEORY TO PRACTICE An International and Multidisciplinary Approach

### **Blended Intensive Programme**

A Blended Intensive Program (BIP) offers the opportunity for a short stay abroad funded by Erasmus+. Its unique feature is the combination of a virtual and a mobile phase. Babeș-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca, Romania, is organizing a summer school on the topic of "Conflict Resolution from Theory to Practice" as part of a BIP, with a virtual phase from February 11-12, 2026, and a mobility phase from February 16-20, 2026. Participation in both phases is mandatory. The language of instruction is English. On virtual seminar days, there will be an online event lasting approximately 5-6 hours. The on-site seminar days consist of teaching units combined with a cultural program. Participants will include students from the host university as well as other European universities participating in the program. Further information on the instructors and course content can be found in the flyer from Babeş-Bolyai University.

# Who can apply?

Eight places are available for bachelor's students (from the third semester onwards) and master's students at the Institute for Social Sciences, with financial support provided. International students who are regularly enrolled in a degree program are also eligible to participate. Disadvantaged students can apply for additional support (see "Financial Support"). In the case of equal qualifications, students with disadvantages ("Fewer Opportunities") will be given preference in the selection process. Please note: Acceptance of a place in the BIP is binding.


## **Application**

- The application deadline is November 16, 2025

  - Letter of motivation (max. 1 page, in English)
  - Current transcript of records (for Master's students in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester also Bachelor's certificate)
  - o Curriculum vitae
  - Language certificate English B2 (not required if studying in English)
  - o If applicable: <u>Declaration of honor</u> regarding "Fewer Opportunities" or to apply for Green Travel (Submit declaration with your application; later requests cannot be considered!).
- Information on the award of places and nomination at the host university will take place by the end of November.

# Documents to be submitted to the host university

- Students will be contacted by Babeş-Bolyai University after nomination and requested to submit the following documents:
  - Copy of identity document
  - Application Form
  - o Pre-filled Learning Agreement
  - o If you are interested: Application for a dorm room







# **Recognition of ECTS**

- As part of the BIP, 3 ECTS (non graded) are awarded.
- Recognition is possible with 3 ECTS in the elective area, as a voluntary additional achievement or in the Master's programs with 2 ECTS in the module professional qualifications and research practice.

# Travel and accommodation

- The travel needs to be organized by the students themselves.
- Babeş-Bolyai University provides accommodation in the dormitories on campus for 7-10€ per night (shared rooms, bed clothes available, kitchen without equipment).
- Alternatively, students can arrange accommodation on their own.
- Catering facilities are available near the campus.

### **Financial support**

- Conclusion of a grant agreement via the International Office for an Erasmus+ grant to cover accommodation and travel costs.
- Funding for the mobility phase with €79 per day (total €395). Virtual seminar days are not eligible for funding.
- Additional grant for students with "Fewer Opportunities" (with a chronic illness, with a disability of 20% or more, first generation university students, working students, and students with accompanying children; please note the exact conditions): one-time top-up of €100.
- In addition, all students receive a travel allowance of €309 for standard travel and €417 for Green Travel.
- Funding for up to 4 additional travel days if these are required due to Green Travel (e.g., bus, train, carpooling).
- Any costs for travel, accommodation, and meals that exceed the funding must be covered by the students themselves. There is no participation fee. The costs for the cultural program will be covered by the host university.
- A detailed explanation of the grants and conditions of the top-ups can be found in the Declaration of Honor.

  - Certificate of Enrollment for the winter semester 2025/26
  - o Proof of recognition in accordance with the Learning Agreement (transcript of records)
